Questions for Session Six

Why did Jesus teach the disciples to take no provisions or money with them? Why did Jesus want the disciples to remain in a home—with the same family—during their stay in one location?
- 3. What should the disciples' reactions be to them, who do not want to welcome them in or to listen to their Good News? How can this be applied to your life here in the twenty-first century?



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4. Who did Herod think Jesus was? What information did he have at his disposal to make such an important decision regarding Jesus and his future? How do you think he formed his opinion?	
5. What had John the Baptist done to infuriate King Herod? Once you have read the passage, describe how the king repaid him.	
6. Did Herod seem to be getting in over his head with his promise to the daughter of Herodias? How did King Herod react to her request? How do we sometimes promise more than we can or should deliver?	
7. Why did Jesus once again choose to go to a quiet place in v. 31? Why do you suppose Jesus and his disciples tried to get away? How did the crowds of people arrive a the "solitary place" ahead of Jesus and his disciples?	
8. What did Jesus do after he directed the disciples to have the people seated in group. What was the reaction of the crowd? Were they satisfied with the meal that Jes provided for them?	s?
