7. Explain the significance of Jesus' instruction to let the children eat? Why did the Syrophoenician woman reference the dogs under the table eating the children's crumbs? Explain in some detail.
8. What did Jesus do for the man in the region of the Decapolis? Why did Jesus sigh when he looked up to heaven? Does God hear our sighs when we pray?
