7. What is meant by the longer ending, referring to vv. 9-20? Why are these verses not thought to be part of the original? What might have happened to the original ending of this gospel? Do you think it might have ended with v. 8? Explain.
8. Name some of the persons to whom the risen Christ appeared? Why did Christ appear to these persons, and what came of these visits? What happened to Christ and the disciples in this "longer ending" of Mark's gospel?
